BA programme in Musical Theatre, 180 higher education credits

Decision, establishment and adoption

The Board of the Faculty of Fine, Applied and Performing Arts at Göteborg University decided on 20 November 2006 to establish a programme in musical theatre and also to adopt the syllabus for the above bachelor's programme. The major subject is musical theatre. The syllabus was revised by the Board of the Faculty of Fine, Applied and Performing Arts on 19 March 2007.

Department

The Academy of Music and Drama is responsible for offering the programme.

Eligibility and selection

In addition to the basic eligibility requirements for studies in higher education, special eligibility requirements apply that comprise acting skills. The knowledge and skills required are assessed during an entrance test on which the selection of eligible applicants is based.

Aims of the programme

The programme is to provide basic professional knowledge in the major subject and also offer a basis for continued studies.

On completion of the programme students will have

- Acquired a sound professional grounding in musical and theatrical performance,
- Enhanced their capacity to study and further develop, in both theory and practice, their personal expression in the genre,
- Enhanced their capacity to acquire tools for theatrical and musical performances,
- Enhanced their ability to work in collective processes,
- Developed the capacity for artistic reflection on their own work,
- Developed understanding and preparedness to encounter changes in their professional careers,
- Acquired a critical cast of thought in relation to the art of musical theatre, and
- Developed a personal, creative and innovative approach to the art of musical theatre.

Contents and organisation of the programme

The programme consists of three years of full-time study in which each year comprises 60 higher education credits and the final year includes an independent project (degree project) for 15 higher

education credits. The major subject is musical theatre which comprises the fields of theatrical and musical performance.

What characterizes the major subject is that it is based on the performance of artists in musical theatre, both in theory and practice. The programme is organised in different levels in which fundamentals, development and innovation are constituent elements. Another important element consists of the students' critical reflection on their own work.

The programme includes the following courses:
